User Disk Quotas Increased to 150MB

Effective April 01, 2005, the amount of free disk space available to each regular user has been increased from 100MB to 150MB. If you need more than 150MB of disk space, you can fill out a form at the desk of the User Consultant (UC) in Speare room 5 to get up to 250MB. Note that you pay \$0.01 per megabyte per day only for disk space that you **actually use** above the 150MB. If you need more than 250MB, please come to Speare room 117.

Change your Password via the Web

Users may now change the password of their TCC account via the web. Just follow these three steps:

1. Using your favorite web browser, open the page:
<https://infohost.nmt.edu/tcc/chpasswd.php>
2. Click the "Yes" button to accept the Certificate
3. Fill out the fields and click the "**Submit New Password**" button

Forwarding your Email via the Web

If you need to forward your email from your TCC account to another email address, you may do this via the web. Just follow these three steps:

1. Using your favorite web browser, open the page:

2. Type in your TCC Username and password
3. Click on the "**Login**" button
4. Enter the new email address that you want your email forwarded to
5. Click on the "**Submit changes**" button

New Scanners

Five new Epson 4180 scanners have been installed to replace the old HP 6180 scanners in room 5 of the Speare building. The Epson scanners support 4,800 dots per inch resolution and use the faster USB-2 communication. Tests show that the Epson scanners can generate a file of a color scan in 4 minutes that took 45 minutes using the old HP scanners. One of the Epson scanners has an auto document feeder.
