It's tax time again and the Library has many of the tax forms and schedules you need. You can find them on the Library's home page: go to 'Resources By Subject', click on 'Other Subjects' and scroll down to 'Taxes'. The New Mexico State Tax form and the 'reproducible forms' are all listed and can be downloaded. Or, the circulation desk has the reproducible forms in a binder that you can use to copy your form.

Not sure where to vote, how to vote, why to vote, or whom to vote for? The Library has a new 'Elections' page in Resources by Subject under 'Other Subjects'. There is a wealth of information contained in these pages from reference materials, the history of elections, statistics from previous years and nine web sites that explain elections, political party information and information on the candidates. The University of Michigan's website page contains the most specific information and the 'YahooNews' site at the bottom reports daily updates on the current status of the elections.

The Library is in the process of acquiring the complete package of 30 titles of the American Society of Civil Engineers to support the University's new program in Civil Engineering. They will be available through electronic access later this semester. These titles are interdisciplinary in nature and will also be useful to Earth and Environmental Science as well as other departments.
