Current technical journals are being reorganized downstairs. Journals currently subscribed to are on the gray shelves to the left of the stairs. The newest issue is displayed and approximately six months of the most recent issues are stored underneath. Pull up the shelf to find those issues. Additionally, journals used and left on the shelving carts are being counted. This survey will determine future collection development. Please don't reshelve the journals. Currently we subscribe to 610 periodicals. Binding past issues of journals will begin in the near future.

### **NEW LINK TO PHYSICS and IEEE JOURNALS ON-LINE**

The Internet has revolutionized information sharing and this is certainly true in the area of scholarly journals. Full-text electronic journals offer several advantages over the print version including desktop delivery, 24-hour availability, and hypertext links to related graphics and data.

The Skeen Library subscribes to over 200 e-journals which can be found on our *Electronic Journals* page [<http://www.nmt.edu/~nmtlib/PERIODICALS/ELECTRONICJOURNALS.htm>] and via the LIBROS Catalog [<http://library.unm.edu>]. These e-journals are accessible from the New Mexico Tech campus or by dialing in with a TCC dial-in account.

In January 2004, look for hundreds more titles to be added including journals from ACS (American Chemical Society), AGU (American Geophysical Union), ACM (Association for Computing Machinery) and Kluwer, a commercial publisher with over 600 journals from all disciplines.
