OPENINGS AT CHILDREN'S CENTER:

--There are full-time openings at NMT Children's Center for children between the ages of 2 and 6. The Center is open from 7:30 - 5:30 Monday through Friday and only closes when the administrative offices are closed. Enrollment is open to anyone in the Socorro community; rates are based on whether parents are students at Tech, work for Tech or are working in the community. FACILITIES MANAGEMENT CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS:

- **Domenici Science Operations Center:** landscaping rehabilitation continues.
- **Kelly Petroleum Building,** staff moving into offices and labs; contractor working on landscaping. Electrical and plumbing upgrades to existing building continue.
- **Fidel Student Services Center:** landscaping on south, to be complete in September. Parking lot is complete and open to parking.
- **Jones Hall Reconstruction:** Two remodeled labs now in use, solar collectors being removed. Flooring, plumbing, electrical upgrades throughout, in progress, to be complete in September 2009.
- **Natural Gas System Improvement:** new gas line along Olive Lane adjacent to Jones and Jones Annex 100% complete, including street repair.
